Celebrating 150th Birth Anniversary of Sister Nivedita National Orientation Workshop

Role of Women to Strengthen the Nation: In Perspective of Sister Nivedita 28-29 October 2017

The Research Centre for Women's Studies (RCWS), SNDT Women's University, Mumbai and Shakti- National Movement for Women and Sharada Shakti, Maharashtra, jointly organized a two-day National Orientation Workshop on the *Role of Women to Strengthen the Nation: In Perspective of Sister Nivedita* on 28 and 29 October 2017 at the J H Mini Auditorium, SNDT Women's University, Juhu Campus, Mumbai.

The workshop aimed at enlightening and educating the younger generation about Sister Nivedita's work for the upliftment of our society, working towards social cultural, scientific and national progress by following the principles of Sister Nivedita, instilling among the youth love for the country and faith in its social and cultural values through the teachings and philosophy of Bhagini Nivedita, focusing on and addressing the present social, cultural, economic issues and national challenges, and bringing together a synergy among the youth and women force of the country to work towards societal reforms and nation building.

The famous acolyte of Swami Vivekananda- Margaret Elizabeth Noble is known the world over as- Bhagini Nivedita. As a female educationist, social reformer, encouraging indigenous scientific revolution and in reawakening the youth she gave her life selflessly to this country. The 150th Birth Anniversary of such a great personality provided a noble opportunity to awake the Nivedita within and to commemorate the living memories of Sister Nivedita.

The Workshop began with the deep prajwalan and lighting of 150 diyas along with arti matrubhoomi and recitation of shakti mantra. Professor Shashikala Wanjari, Vice Chancellor SNDT Women's University presided over the inaugural session. Akhil Bhartiya Mahila Samanvay Sanyojika Mananiya Geeta tai Gunde was the chief guest of the inaugural programme. Mrs. Sudhaji Tiwari, President Shakti also addressed the gathering. Key note address on *Bhagini Nivedita- A Comprehensive Life Sketch* was delivered by Shri Rangahari ji (former Rashtriya Boudhik Pramukh, revered scholar, Cochin). Dr. Archana Bhatnagar (OSD, SNDT WU) gave the formal vote of thanks. Prama, an annual magazine by Shakti, was also unveiled as souvenir during inauguration.

Around 120 delegates across the nation working for social reforms and women empowerment had participated in the workshop along with faculties and students of SNDT Women's University.
