The Saakshar Bharat Awards applications will be scrutinized and finalized by a specially constituted jury. Separate application should be made for each category of Award. The prescribed application forms are available on SNDT Women's University website sndt.ac.in

Hard copy of the application duly filled along with all necessary supporting

documents, evidences and photographs should be forwarded through SLMA for awards mentioned at S.No. 1 to 3. Applications for award at S.No. 4 'Resource Support Organisations' (University Deptts. of Adult & Continuing Education, SRCs, JSSs and other organisations) should be sent directly. The category of award, should be clearly indicated on the top of envelope.

The applications should reach the address given below on or before 3rd August, 2017 by 04.00 p.m. through Speed Post (Indian Postal Services) only. Application received after the due date will not be entertained and influence in any form will be treated as disqualification.
