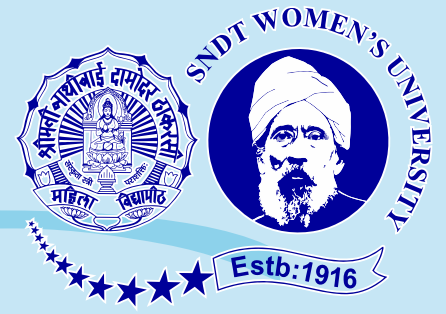

In the International Conference of Working Women held in 1910, a German socialist and feminist, Clara Zetkin proposed the idea of an international day to celebrate women and their achievements. The proposal was unanimously accepted and the first International Women's Day (IWD) was celebrated on 19th of March, 1911. On the day, people in a number of European countries held rallies in support of women's rights to work, vote, and hold public office. However, it was not until 1975 that the United Nations officially recognized it and 8th March came to be designated as IWD. Since its inception, IWD has become a call for inclusion of women and establishment of a society based on peace and equity. In India, the constitution is the most important guarantor of women's rights. Universal adult suffrage and the fundamental rights contained Chapter 3 of Indian constitution provide the basis of egalitarianism. In addition to this, the constitution also directs the state to improve the status of women. Despite the legal provisions, women's representation in the decision-making positions—be it governance, law enforcement or large enterprise leadership- is far from proportionate. Women make up 48.5% of India's population. Their representation in Lok Sabha is 14.8% and 10% in Rajya Sabha. They constitute less than 7 % of the members of Cabinet, 8.4% of judges, 17.3% in Civil Services, 5.8% in police. Women own 10.3 % of medium and small scale enterprises, and are CEOs of only 2.3% of companies. Less than 30% women participated in the labour force. These data only iterates the need to emphasise on women inclusion. Women's inclusion can be achieved at two levels; One, legislations, service and policy

changes. Thus for instance, laws against domestic violence legislation, equal property rights for women, provision of early childhood services freeing women's time for other productive activities, reservation of seats in legislature, boards and management, etc.; will create more conducive conditions for women to be included. The second and the more difficult task is to bring change in the second level- the societal framework; which even today, limits women merely to child bearing and care giving roles. This denial of autonomy not only disempowers women, but also has consequences for economy and society. It is estimated that women's inclusion alone will increase the country's GDP by 60%. A change in the societal mind-set is not easy and requires consistent efforts at education, awareness building and consciously recognising the need for women's empowerment. Women's influence in the society is mediated through household relations. It is the household that shapes attitudes towards women. A starting point to women's empowerment could be to recognise women's decision-making in the 'household' as a critical factor. Studies indicate that women are playing an important role in family decision making and this is a positive trend. However, for women to become autonomous decision makers, their access to education, employment and health, childcare and safety are of paramount importance. These avenues are likely to improve women's agency and to enable them to negotiate greater autonomy for themselves. It would also change attitude towards them, paving the way for equity. Till then, celebrating IWD will continue to serve as reminder for creating a more inclusive society.

In Collaboration with Golpo Productions Organized a play
Paper Walls



"Paper Walls" a play performed for the postgraduate students of psychology through a laudable collaboration between S.N.D.T.W.U Department of Psychology and Golpo Productions on 7th of February 2023. It was an enriching experience for the students as it made evocative points and conveyed a strong, lasting impact on its audience. The plot of the play revolved around the perpetuation of intergenerational sexual trauma as a mother and her daughter grapple with the heartbreaking reality of the abuses they suffered.

Paper walls is a short play of 80 mins, which is based on the director and writer Sharodiya Chowdhury, who explained that she has used the term 'paperwalls', because she wants to relate the impact of trauma affecting the human body in the same manner any damage to the paper affects its shape.

Intergenerational trauma refers to the transmission of traumatic experiences and their effects from one generation to the next. Healing from intergenerational sexual trauma requires addressing both the individual experiences of trauma and the larger societal and cultural factors that perpetuate it, which was beautifully in sync with the message of the play.

The play follows a young girl who is trying to keep the peace between her parents who are slowly drifting apart while also dealing with growing feelings for her friend. Unfortunately, amidst all this, she's sexually abused by her boyfriend's friend and discovers one in her mother who had also experienced a similar incident. The play ends with the mother coming to terms with her past trauma and thereby also relieving her daughter from the similar phantom pressure.

After the play, Clinical psychologist Tanvi Sardesai conducted some grounding techniques. These are strategies used to help individuals stay present in the moment and can be especially helpful for individuals who experience anxiety, panic, or traumatic flashbacks. The goal is to redirect one's attention from overwhelming thoughts, feelings or sensations and to provide a sense of stability and calm.

This was followed by a short question answer and feedback round from the students. Students appreciated the script's symbolism, their experience while watching it, as well as the performances of the actors who were able to accurately portray the topic with ease.

Organisation of Two Days University Level Workshop on NET and SET Exams

SNDT Women's University, Department of Economics, Mumbai in collaboration with Janseva Samiti Sanchalit, Shri M D Shah Mahila College & Marwadi Sammelan's B M Ruia Girls College organised workshop for the Post-graduate students and teachers on 3rd and 4th



February, 2023. Hon'ble Dr. Ruby Ojha, Pro Vice Chancellor of SNDT Women's University inaugurated the workshop. She addressed the students and motivated them.

Two alumni students (Ms. Sonali Jha and Ms. Kalyani Sarkale) who qualified their SET/NET exam in the duration of 2020 to 2022 were felicitated by Honourable Pro Vice Chancellor. Qualified candidates shared their experiences and guided how to prepare for these examinations.

On the first day, the first session was taken by Dr. Rashinkar Gajanan Shankarrao, Professor of Chemistry, Shivaji University, Kolhapur on NET/SET Exam. He started the session by motivating students. He shared strategies to prepare and crack the UGC NET/SET exam. It was a very engaging session and students learned a lot of things. Second session was on 'Teaching Aptitude' by Dr. Mahesh Koltame. He explained the subject briefly. He highlighted the ideal role of a teacher in shaping students' careers, how a teacher should behave in and outside the classroom. He also gave some practice questions in class. Third session was on 'Research Aptitude' by Dr. Rekha Chavan. She took an overview of the entire research process. Explained the meaning and research types in detail with practical examples. She also gave an introduction to data analysis. Fourth session on 'ICT and Higher Education and Communication' by Dr. Madhavi Dharankar. She spoke on the transition of education in India. Conservative to distance to blending teaching approach. Today many new technologies like zoom, google meet etc have transitioned the field of education. Fifth session was on

'Mathematical Reasoning and Logical Reasoning' by Ms. Vinita Shrouthy. She brushed upon the basics of maths and taught with tricks. Revised topics like Mensuration, relation, Date of Months, Coding decoding. First day embed with a small quiz. A Google form link was created and shared with students.

Second day sessions were for Paper 2 Subject i.e Economics. The Resource persons gave valuable insights and tips to crack the exam. First session was on Microeconomics delivered by Ms. Aparna Kulkarni. She mentioned that intensive learning is required and threw light on some important topics. She emphasised the importance of mathematics for preparing micro economics. She guided students to practise MCQs consistently. Second session was conducted by Dr. Shashikant Mundhe on the topic Macro Economics. Sir touched upon all the major topics and mentioned that thorough understanding of the subject is needed. Third session on Statistics and Econometrics by Dr. Kishor Kadam. He first explained the theory part and simultaneously gave students to solve numericals based on the specific topic. He covered concepts like probability, Measures of Central Tendency, Dispersion, Correlation, Regression Etc. Fourth session was delivered by Prof. Satyanarayan Kothe on Mathematical Economics. Sir explained the importance of Maths while studying Economics and Discussed the importance of Diagrams. He gave many real time examples in order to explain concepts like utility, law of demand etc. He stressed on the fact of 'Love and Live Economics'. He advised students to be extraordinary and indispensable. The valedictory session was witnessed by Prof. Vilas Nandavadekar, Registrar, SNDT Women's University. He appreciated the kind of interest, guided, motivated the students for competitive exams and felicitated a few high scoring students of the test taken on the first day.

The Workshop was extremely informative and beneficial for the students, as they developed better understanding on the subject. 84 students and teachers were registered for this workshop. Dr. Nooruzia Qazi proposed the vote of thanks.

Dr Gaikwad provided an overview of the historical scholarship of Shivaji Maharaj, beginning from Grant Duff to the Kolhapur-based scholar Dr Jaysinghrao Pawar. Dr Gaikwad spoke about the military victories, naval battles, administrative policies and social justice initiatives of Maharaj and concluded his excellent presentation with a reference to the Maharaj's importance for writing of a nationalist history. Faculty Development Programme on 'Excellence in Education'



The coordinator Ms Abraham welcomed all the participants and the guests to the programme. The Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Excellence in Education' was inaugurated by the Our Chief Guest Prof. Vibhuti Patel (Former Professor of Advanced Centre for Women's Studies School of Development Studies TISS, Mumbai), Dr D.N. Sansanwal (Retd. Head and Dean Faculty of Education Devi Ahilya University, Indore) and Prof. Sujata Bhan (Head of Department of Special Education, SNDT Women's University,

Mumbai). The programme was followed by singing the University song. Prof. Bhan, in her address, welcomed all the respective dignitaries and participants for their valuable presence and motivated them. She highlighted that research could underpin professional learning of knowledge, skills and understanding and urged the researchers to actively take steps to reach out to all. She further conveyed her sincere thanks to Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) to accredit CRE status for the Rehabilitation Professionals. Ms Abraham, then invited Prof. Patel to give her keynote address. Prof. Patel emphasized the need to create an ecosystem of quality education to see education as an investment and an area of human development. Education is not only about reading and writing but its relationship with nature. She concludes by saying the need of the hour is to provide women with a foundation in math and science. Ms Abraham set the tone for the 5-day faculty development programme by giving the overview of the entire programme.

Day 1 (February 7, 2023)



The sessions for the day started by Dr D.N. Sansanwal, Retd. Head and Dean Faculty of Education Devi Ahilya University, Indore on the topic 'Introduction to Research, Research Paradigms and Approaches'. Dr Sansanwal's energy level inspired the participants. His teaching style was unique, and full of humor and wit. He explained the method of teaching and challenged our thinking in a way that left an everlasting impact on how the research as a whole is understood. He explained the

meaning of research and the characteristics of research. The different bases for classifying research - type of information, methodological basis, and degree of utility of research findings.

In Session II, he then continued and spoke on the topic 'Research Process: Conceptualizing to Conducting'. He states that research starts as a broad area, but we, as researchers have to narrow it down till it cannot be narrowed down further, that's when we can identify the research problem. He explained the process of research along with examples to provide better clarity to the participants.

The last session was resumed by Dr Sansanwal on the topic 'Writing a Research Proposal'. He started the session by giving time to the participants to think and brainstorm about the research problem. The participants shared their research problems and developed the title for their own research proposal. He stated a list of green flags and red flags in writing the research proposal through the topic given by the participants, the focus was also on identifying the research variables and writing the hypotheses knowing the basis of the proposed hypothesis.

Day 2 (February 8, 2023)



The session on day 2 was conducted by Prof. Sybil Thomas, General Manager, Academics and Training, Maharashtra State Faculty Development Academy, Pune and co-taught by Prof. Pradnya Wakpajjan, Head, Department of Education SNDTWU, Mumbai on the topic 'Ethical Considerations in Research'. Prof. Thomas and Prof. Wakpajjan explained the term ethics by highlighting its characteristics. They discussed the need for discussing ethics in research and indicated that there is a need to look at research from a changed perspective. Prof. Thomas and Prof.

Wakpajjan also shed light on different approaches to ethics in research which we witness only when we undertake research. They concluded by stating the guidelines to make research 'responsible'. The Session V was on 'Literature Review: Concept, Process and Types' delivered by Prof. Smita Shukla, Director, IQAC, Director, Alkesh Dinesh Mody Institute for Financial and Management Studies University of Mumbai, Mumbai. Prof. Shukla discussed the importance of reviewing the related literature and defining the scope of reviewing the related literature. She explained the process of conducting a literature review and demonstrated the use of various strategies and tools which help in identifying relevant literature and organizing the data. She also provided guidelines for organizing the literature and concluded by highlighting the characteristics of an effective literature review.

The next session was conducted by Dr Varsha Gathoo, Retd. Head of the Department, Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities, Mumbai on 'Writing a Research Report'. Dr Gathoo highlighted the difference between an abstract, summary, and executive summary. According to her, research report is a systematic presentation of factual presentation with illustrating examples of the nature of each section of the research report. She concluded by talking about the appropriate language to be used while writing research report. The seventh session was delivered on 'Publishing Research' by Dr Sarika Sawant, Associate Professor SHPT School of Library Science, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai. Dr Sawant started her session by boosting everyone's morale and confidence to make the research visible to others ethically by sharing about her own journey of failures and how she

learned and overcame from it. Dr Sawant helped the participants identify various Avenues for publishing research and gave tips about identifying the right journals for publishing the work. She described the process of publication from submission of the article being published including the embargo period. She also discussed the ethics involved in publishing and stated that futuristic papers should be written and always focus on quality over quantity.

Day 3 (February 9, 2023)



Prof. Raj Gupta, Retd. Professor Dept. of Education, Panjab University, Chandigarh facilitated the session on 'Experimental Research'. She clarified the concept of experiment and experimental research by explaining the process of conducting experimental research through real-time examples from her study. She also explained the concepts of variables and various experimental designs. She shed light on internal and external threats to the validity of experiments and a lot of emphasis was given

to ethics related to Experimental Research through real-time examples. She discussed the concepts of variables and experimental designs. She clarified many dilemmas related to Experimental Research. During the session, Prof. Gupta gave an exercise to the participants where they were asked to identify the topics which can be an example of experimental design. The next session was followed by Prof. Anita Julka, Retd. Professor, NCERT, New Delhi on the topic 'Descriptive Research'. She discussed the concept and meaning of Descriptive Research. She explained that this type of research design that aims to systematically obtain information to describe a phenomenon, situation, or population. More specifically, it helps answer the what, when, where, and how questions regarding the research problem rather than the why. She also emphasized on that the researcher can conduct this research using various methodologies. Prof. Julka also highlighted that descriptive research predominantly employs quantitative data, although qualitative data is sometimes used for descriptive purposes.

Prof. Pradnya Wakpajjan, Head, Department of Education, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai conducted a session on 'Correlational Research'. She started her session with a discussion round by asking questions like 'What are the factors that influence the student's scientific attitude? Followed by another question 'What are the aspects of personality that get influenced by scientific attitude? She then explained the difference between Correlation and Causality, different methods of Correlation, and their application, and discussed how to interpret the correlation coefficients. She mentioned the Path analysis and regression analysis techniques. She also showed a Diagrammatic representation of the "Overlapping of variables" which made the concept very clear.

Session XI on 'Analyzing Quantitative Data' was delivered by Dr Vidya Naik, Retd. Faculty NMIMS University, Mumbai. She started her session by explaining the connection between the research problem, research objectives, data collection process, and data analysis. She emphasized the importance of data sanitization in data analysis and described the factors that determine the choice of statistical techniques - the type of data, objectives, and nature of the hypothesis. She further explained the key concepts - confidence interval, statistic and parameter, standard error, degrees of freedom, level of significance, p-value, errors in interpretation, one and two-tailed tests.

Day 4 (February 10, 2023)



Prof. Mythili Ramchand, Chairperson, Center of Excellence in Teacher Education, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai delivered a session on 'Action Research'. She started the session with an activity to understand 'Action Research' better and clarified doubts of the participants. Prof. Ramchand created such an environment which included interactive discussion to broaden the learning of the participants. Prof. Ramchand, then invited her research scholar to share her research study which was based on action work. This further added clarity on how Action Research could be used in a Ph.D. thesis. Prof. Ramchand

described the key features of action research by illustrating the importance of action research and explained the difference between action research and experimental research by giving examples from research which were undertaken either by her or her research scholars.

The following session was conducted by Prof. Richard Rose, Professor Emeritus Inclusive Education, University of Northampton, UK on 'Case Study Research and Historical Research'. Prof. Rose explained the nature of the case study and gave several examples from the research he had conducted in many countries using qualitative approaches. His examples aided the participants in understanding about how a case study can be beneficial for the individual or the small group. He made a strong statement 'Unfortunately teachers look at the student as a case and not as a child. We must have a humanistic approach.'. Prof. Rose pinpointed the fact that a case study is not a method, but it involves many methods. His session gave us insights into various types of case studies - embedded and phenomenological by explaining the process of conducting case study research and concluded by highlighting the different types and sources of data that are used in case study research.

In his next session on 'Grounded Theory', Prof. Rose started the session with an activity of getting to know people whom the participants did not interacted since day 1 by having simple conversations. With this activity, he explained the meaning of grounded theory research and shed light on how it does not start with a theory, it is a bottom-up approach; which is exploratory research. The data for grounded theory is obtained from real-world participants in the real-world setting using qualitative methods through interviews and observation. He quoted Glaser and Strauss (1967) "Researchers should focus less on the existing theories and start to focus on the investigation in hand." He concluded

by explaining the process of data analysis - coding, memoing, sorting, and theory finding.

The last session of Day 4 was continued by Prof. Rose on 'Narrative Research'. Prof. Rose explained another type of research i.e. Narrative research and introduced an additional term which is known as 'life story research'. Prof. Rose discussed that the researcher seeks to find the meaning behind the story. He also explained that restoring of narratives is an important step in the process. He gave the participants a glimpse of various examples and linked them with how people make sense of their life



by telling their own stories. According to Prof. Rose, narratives are influenced by Culture, Religious Beliefs, Education, Gender, History, etc.

Day 5 (February 11, 2023)

The session on the last day of the programme was started by Prof. Rose. He delivered the session on 'Methods of Qualitative Data'. Prof. Rose explained the research process based

on the questions that was raised in the study by Nind (2014). He states that the relationship between research and action is critical. He explains that as a researcher, one should not make promises about the outcomes or the results. He also emphasized on Inclusive research and the commitment to social justice, respect for individuals, and bringing about change. He projected the Global perspective of how Inclusive Education is related to Inclusive Research and how qualitative research is about making relationships and getting rid of hierarchies while respecting and valuing individual opinions. He highlights that we include people in research who are most interested in the process of Inclusive Education. He concludes in his session by mentioning inclusive research from a human rights perspective and how women were excluded from it.

Prof. Rose continued the next session and shared his expertise knowledge on 'Analyzing Qualitative Data'. Prof. Rose explained the steps in qualitative data analysis which are data segmentation, generating open codes, data reduction, axial coding, and development of themes. He believes that one should have respect for data holders, and should follow a systematic process of research, should know the importance of learning by doing, and should share research findings with the participants. In the initial stage of coding, the researchers derive code and apply

these to the data. He concluded by referring to research scholars and said that researcher should not look at the data every day, and hence conceptual definitions are important.

The programme came to an end with valedictory programme. The proceedings of the five-day faculty development programme were briefed by Ms Harsha Jain and Ms Rukaiya Sabuwala (M.Ed. Special Education – LD/VI Teacher Trainees) under the guidance of Dr Apoorva Panshikar. Hon'ble Pro VC Prof. Ruby Ojha (SNDD Women's University, Mumbai) in her address, briefly explained the importance of student's growth for the overall Institutional success. She also focused on how research is important and enables people to discover different ideas, viewpoints, theories, and facts. Dr Medha Tapiawala (Dean, Faculty of Humanities, SNDD Women's University, Mumbai) congratulated the department for organizing FDP on such an important theme. She highlighted the importance and relevance of the topic in the current scenario.

The programme was ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Prof. Sujata Bhan (Department of Special Education, SNDD Women's University, Mumbai). She conveyed her sincere thanks to the Hon'ble VC Madam, Hon'ble Pro VC Madam, Prof. Richard Rose, participants for the for the successful completion of the programme and Staff (Teaching and Non-Teaching) endlessly working towards the programme and making it a success and. The participants shared their learnings over the past five days. They gave oral and written feedback.

The last session of the 5-day programme was conducted by Dr Rajshri Mahtani, Founder Convener Knowledge Whiteboard, Mumbai on the topic 'Mixed Method Research'. Dr Mahtani explained the mixed method as the research approach whereby researchers collect and analyze both quantitative and qualitative data within the same study. In short, there is a use of both qualitative and quantitative research. She introduced the two concepts of mixed method approach i.e., judgement calls and fault lines. She stated that multi-method research is another name for mixed research. She also explained triangulation in research which means using multiple datasets, methods, theories and/or investigators to address a research question. Dr Mahtani provided hands-on experience to the participants. Dr Mahtani asked the participants to follow the principles of triangulation and prepare a research problem.
