**Title**: Mapping an Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on the Employment Status with Special Reference to Housemaids: A Comparative Study of Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) and Nashik Municipal Corporation (NMC), Maharashtra.

### Objectives:

- To bring out the general scenario of Covid-19 spread with reference to the population.
- To quantify the wave wise spatio-temporal transmission of Covid-19.
- To assess a socio-economic status of housemaids in pre and post Covid-19 pandemic.
- To compare the socio-economic status of housemaids in PMC and NMC.
- To suggest the resilient policy measures and management strategies for the inclusion of housemaids in the mainstream economy.

#### **Outcomes:**

- The study highlights unambiguous contrasts in population density across PMC's wards, with areas like Bhavani Peth showing extremely high densities, creating ideal conditions for virus transmission.
- The first wave brought mobility restrictions and a drop in income, with many earning below ₹7,000 per month. Although restrictions were relaxed during the second wave, income levels remained affected, highlighting the ongoing financial hardships.
- The gendered nature of domestic work disproportionately affects women, subjecting them to exploitation and abuse. The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic has further exacerbated these vulnerabilities, leading to significant job losses and financial insecurities.
- National and state governments should recognize domestic work as formal employment, ensuring that domestic workers are covered by labor laws and social security benefits.
